APPOINTMENT BY THE PRESIDENT.

Edward McVane, to be Receiver of Public Monies at Helena, Ark.—Nick Davis Thompson, resigned.

REAL ESTATE BANK—DISCUSSION OF THIS MURKIN COURT.
