MR. COOPER: Yeah, he never indicated to me that he paid it or anybody else paid it. But apparently somebody paid it. Him or Tom Goss paid it. It appears that way.

MR. ELSER: Just so we have it on tape, I don't remember if we recorded it. So just relate what happened between -- when you were present between Woods and Rusty. Can you relate it again? I don't think it was on tape because we were going to ask about that last time, and just so that we have it.

MR. COOPER: We were just -- our office is straight across the street from the capital, and a lot of senators and representatives would come over there and talk. You know, we'd ask them, hey, we need help on this bill and they'd come over and talk about it. And Woods came in and -- I don't know what day it was.

Whenever. But anyway, he essentially threatened Rusty in front of me and said, "I'm not wearing a wire. I have people that I have to take care of today. I need my \$30,000 by the end of work today." Rusty -- probably because I was in the room -- told him to "Go fuck himself. I don't know what you're talking about." And he said, "I will ruin you on the hill if I don't have my money by the end of the day. There's people I have to

take care of." I think one of them he was talking about 2 was Michael Lamoureux, president of the senate at the 3 time. 4 MR. CESSARIO: Why do you think that? 5 MR. COOPER: Because Michael and Woods were real instrumental in Woods getting the \$2 million. MR. CESSARIO: Okay. MR. COOPER: Michael worked whatever magic with 8 the governor's office to say, hey, we're going to give 10 this guy 2 million. 11 MR. CESSARIO: So you think Woods owed 12 Lamoureux some money based on that transaction? MR. COOPER: That's what it sounded like. I 13 don't know who else he would have owed it to, because 14 15 Lamoureux was the one who could say, yeah -- because if 16 you're president of The Senate, you get to say where 17 it's going. 18 MR. CESSARIO: Do you know how he would have 19 paid him? 20 MR. COOPER: Well, I mean, if Rusty or Tom 21 would have given him cash money, I'm assuming somewhere 22 he would have gave part of it --23 MR. CESSARIO: Okay. 24 MR. COOPER: -- to Lamoureux or same as the 25 Neal thing. The same deal.



1 MR. CESSARIO: Okav. 2 MR. ELSER: So do you remember -- do you 3 remember when approximately that was, Eddie? Do you have any idea on a time frame for that meeting? 4 MR. COOPER: That would have been the second 5 6 legislative session Jon Woods served as senator, about three months after the session ended. Because it took about that long before the state started disbursing the 8 9 money. 10 MR. ELSER: So in '13 is when he got -- it's his first term. Is that his first term in '13? 11 MR. COOPER: I thought it was his second. 12 13 MR. ELSER: That's his first. So he gets 14 elected in '12 and begins serving in '13? 15 MR. COOPER: Does he have a four-year term? 16 MR. CESSARIO: Yes. They changed the rules at 17 that point I think to four years. 18 MR. COOPER: Well, you draw. 19 MR. CESSARIO: Yeah. 20 MR. COOPER: It's luck of draw whether you get a 2 or 4 when you're a senator. I didn't know what 21 22 length he had. 23 MR. ELSER: That's right. Because he was 24 running again this time. That's right. 25 MR. COOPER: But I thought it was in the second



1 term that he got so much money. It might have been the 2 first.

MR. ELSER: It was the first. So that would mean that it was after the session had ended in '13 but before the money had been sent out by the agencies or, you know?

MR. COOPER: Right. And whatever day -- apparently, it was time for the agencies to send the money out.

MR. ELSER: Right. So the process -- just see if I have this right. They do the appropriation bills for the GIF funds. Then there's a bill at the end that funds it all, and that's when you determine whether or not particular appropriations are actually going to get money out of that and how much; is that right?

MR. COOPER: Right.

MR. ELSER: And then there's a period, depending on where the money goes, for the development districts, it goes to DF&A. Some of them go to DHS. But anyway, they have that process where the session ends, and there's a period before the money actually gets transmitted from those agencies for purposes of the grant; is that right?

MR. COOPER: Yeah. That's right. And the state kind of drags their feet along on it. And, you



know, it may -- it may be like July 1st when it happens. 1 2 MR. ELSER: Right. 3 MR. COOPER: The fiscal year of the state was July 1st to June 30th. They don't run January to January. That's their budget cycle. 5 MR. ELSER: So at some point, probably July or 6 7 maybe after July 1st is when the money actually gets released because it's now going to be available for the 8 new fiscal term? Something like that? 9 10 MR. COOPER: Yeah. 11 MR. ELSER: And so it's going to be during that 12 period where Woods has already known -- he knows now the money has been released and he needs -- he's demanding 13 14 30,000 to pay somebody else and says he's got to pay 15 them today; is that right? 16 MR. COOPER: Right. 17 MR. ELSER: Okay. MR. COOPER: And the state -- I say they drag 18 19 their feet. The state is funded in three categories, A, B, and C. A is mandatory. Keep your prisons open, 20 21 whatever. You know? The schools, mandatory things that 22 have to be done. Category B, GIF would fall under. it's available, it gets out. Category C never gets 23 24 funded.



MR. ELSER: Right.

1 MR. COOPER: You can pass anything you want. 2 If it gets put in category C, nothing is going to 3 happen. MR. ELSER: Okay. So, now, I guess, do you 4 know about the -- some of the GIF funds going to South 5 Arkansas Youth Services and a Jerry Walsh? 6 MR. COOPER: Well, I didn't know -- I don't know that. But when you started asking me questions about that, I -- my mind started clicking. Well, if GIF 9 10 money went there, I understand how it could have been paid out. It was probably not paid out -- it wasn't 11 said, you know, you're getting paid from GIF money. But 12 13 got paid for something. 14 MR. ELSER: Right. 15 MR. COOPER: And the way that -- if there was 16 GIF money that Walsh and youth services -- South Arkansas Youth Services -- if they did get GIF money --17 18 for whatever reason, Jerry Walsh had -- he paid Rusty 19 Cranford's son enough money over a two-year period that 20 he bought and paid for a house in Little Rock that cost 21 \$125,000. 22 MR. ELSER: So Chase Cranford you're talking 23 about? 24 MR. COOPER: Right. 25 MR. CESSARIO: Did Chase ever work there?
