They were friends and buddies in the army home and overseas—two men who had been together for years. That friendship seems to have faded out completely now with two of them out on bail and the other in the hands of prosecuting attorneys at the hearing in Municipal court today.

The principals in the case are R. D. Reese, formerly of the Louisiana Cavalry, and J. E. Kenney, aged 23, living at 409 Fletcher street, and H. C. Henley, 317 East Second street.

Reese is charged with robbery while Henley is held as a suspect. Since the three left the service, Reese has devoted his time to farming, while the other two have worked at mercantile pursuits and earned good money. Henley intended to leave yesterday for "Cincinnati."

Reese returned from Cincinnati and Henley came back to the city. Reese believed it had, in fact Reese had not heard of Henley until he saw him in a hotel with him. Reese was in a pocketbook slip-out of an overalls pocket. Reese said he did not know Henley had hidden in a hotel. Henley said he was with Henley's mother and she had told him to come to the city.
