GLOBE FLIERS ON OCEAN HOP TODAY

Mears and Brown Plan to Start Atlantic Flight at Dawn.

WEATHER PROSPECTS GOOD

Fair Hopes to Beat Zeppelin's Record of Circling World in 21 Days.

Harbor Creek, N. P., Aug. 2.—(P)—John Henry Mears, who twice in a comparatively short time has broken the round-world time record only to see it again shattered, was poised here tonight for the longest hop of his latest effort, 1,000 miles across the North Atlantic from this airport to the Balmoral airfield at Dublin, Ireland.

Mears landed at 1:30 p. m. Eastern Standard time today in his red and silver monoplane, the city of New York, after a flight from Roosevelt Field, N. Y., in the last of eight hours of his journey. The distance is 1,160 miles.

With him were Henry J. Brown, 31-year-old air mail pilot, in his first long-over-water take, and Thelwell I. A. Terrell, the girl pilot, who is flying from New York to New York. Both were given a special flight to the airport at 10:30 a. m. today.

Mears set a new record in 1923 by flying from New York to New York in 21 days, 15 hours, 51 minutes. In 1924 he made a new mark in 19 days, 15 hours, 51 minutes. On this trip he was accompanied by Terrell and Brown. The flight was made to cover Europe and Asia and to break the record set by Zeppelin.

The Zeppelin-Brown flight tomorrow will be the first west to east flight attempted in 1930. M. G. Wynne, who is flying from New York to New York, is the first attempt on July 10, 1930. The flight was made in a plane which was destroyed by a storm on the coast of New York.
