

NOTORIOUS KILLERS SLAIN IN THEIR CAR

Clyde Barrow and Bonnie Parker Riddled as They Dash Into Ambush.

BOTH REACHING FOR GUNS

Louisiana Sheriff, Tipped Off as to Outlaws' Plans, Prepares Successful Trap.

Acadia, La., May 23.—Clyde Barrow, Texas killer, and his gunwoman, Bonnie Parker, were ambushed and slain today by a posse led by a Louisiana sheriff and an old-time Texas ranger near here today. The couple, whizzing along the Cameron-Salis road, a little-used highway, were 80 miles from here when they were spotted by a posse of about 20 men, who were waiting for them. Before the thugs could get their guns into action, the officers hid them with bullets.

Barrow's car careened from the road and smashed into an embankment. The posse continued to fire until the car was almost shot to pieces, and the couple were killed.

The body of Barrow, who four years ago was a minor hoodlum, was slumped behind the steering wheel. The body of Bonnie Parker, who had been with her husband for nearly three years, was slumped behind the steering wheel.

"We killed Clyde and Bonnie at 9:15 this morning," reported "Red" Hinton, one of the Texas officers. "They were at Black Lake, a hideout we had been waiting for them for several days."

Fred Hanger, former captain of the Texas Rangers, who had been waiting for the couple for days for Barrow to come out, said:

"Clyde and Bonnie did not get to fire a shot. They were hit by bullets and ammunition, but they did not get to use their guns."

U. S. WILL OPPOSE JAP NAVAL PARITY

New Fortifications in Pacific to Be Considered if Ratio Upset.

SWANSON FOR 5-5-3 BASIS

American Building of Defenses on Islands, Except Hawaii, Prohibited Under Treaty.

Washington, May 23.—(AP)—Secretary Swanson said today that Japanese insistence on equal parity with the United States and Great Britain would throw wide open the question of additional American fortifications in the Pacific.

Asked whether Pacific defenses should be of a different type than those in the Atlantic, Swanson said the question would be considered.

"I believe in maintaining the present ratio," Swanson asserted. "The Japanese powers are not to be distributed the naval power in the way they thought and for their best interests. I see no reason to change it at this time."

The United States-Great Britain-Japan ratio is 5-5-3.
