10 Are Dead After Tornado Hits Woodruff
Ten storm deaths in the area extending eight to 10 miles west and northwest of Cotton Plant in Woodruff County were reported by Palmer Simpson of Forrest City, representative of the St. Louis Red Cross office, at 10:15 p. m. Simpson, reporting from Cotton Plant, said of the 10 known dead: nine were Negroes and one was white. He identified the white man as Bonnie Davis, aged 40, farmer, living near Cotton Plant.
