Encourage Exploration

Under present law, oil producers are permitted to exclude 27 1/2 percent of gross income as depletion allowance to compensate for depletion of their oil reserves. Other groups covered by the depletion allowance is considered comparable with tax treatment accorded other forms of business with permanent productive capacity. It also is designed to help offset the risk of wildcatting for new production.

Lower Rates Sought

John Foster Dulles Dies in His Sleep

Washington, May 24 (AP)—John Foster Dulles, aged 71, former Secretary of State, died of cancer today. President Eisenhower called him a lifetime laborer for world peace, a foe only to tyranny, and "one of the truly great men of our time."

Radiation Not Enough

Heavy radiation treatment failed to stop the disease, although Dulles was able to leave the hospital for a time for a respite in Florida. By April 12 he was back at the hospital, never to leave again. Three days after his return, Mr. Eisenhower reluctantly accepted Dulles' resignation as secretary of state.

The conference will be in recess Wednesday and Thursday. An American delegation spokesman announced Russia Foreign Minister Andrei A. Gromyko expressed to Secretary of State Christian A. Herter over the telephone his "deepest condolences" and that he fully understood Herter's desire to hurry home for the funeral.

Arkansas Jumps From Stalled Jet

From the Associated Press. First Lt. George Paul Queen, 27, of Little Rock, a Marine B-57 crew pilot, parachuted to safety yesterday shortly before his jet plane crashed into a Mississippi River bank about 40 miles south of Memphis. Queen, a student at the University of Arkansas Medical Center, said his plane engine "blacked out" at 8,000 feet. After several attempts to restart the jet, Queen ejected himself from the F9F-C Cougar. He was unhurt.
